

Foss How Area



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You climb at your own risk. Climbing is a dangerous activity carrying the risk of serious injury or death. If you climb, the presumption is that you are aware of and accept these risks together with responsibility for your activities and your safety. You are the sole judge of conditions, the suitability of any chosen route, the ability of the party and you take sole responsibility for your actions. Rock is a dynamic medium and rockfalls are frequent. In the mountains the weather changes quickly, climbs change unpredictably; blocks, flakes and holds become loose and fall off, rock becomes vegetated and dirty, in situ gear deteriorates or disappears. Even a minor change can have a dramatic effect on the difficulty or seriousness of a route. There can be no presumption that any given climb will be found in the condition described. It is therefore essential that climbers judge the seriousness or difficulty of any route before committing themselves.

Introduction

This is the tiny vertical wall of immaculate rock by the cascades of Tarn Beck, about a kilometre below the outlet of Seathwaite Tarn. **Topo in Duddon guide p 187**

Approach

Follow a wire fence rightwards, crossing it at the top of the ridge where the cascades come into view. Drop down to the beck and follow it up to the crag.

Descent

Towards the beck.

1 What's all the Foss about ? E6 6c 13m

Described by some as the *Strawberries* of the Duddon Valley. A searing and uncompromising line. Start as for *Foss Night Nerves* and follow it into *Rough Diamond*. Continue using the left-hand crack and the wall above to finish at the top of the arête. Wrestle the bush back to the belay.

2 Foss Night Nerves E6 6b 13m

The direct start to *Rough Diamond*. Start at the left-hand edge of the crag by a large foot hold. Boulder up to a resting position on the leftwards-facing ramp and some gear. Turn the overlap on the right and finish up the *Rough Diamond* headwall but this time without the benefit of the rest.

2.10.2014 N Pike, S Pike

3 Rough Diamond E6 6b 12m

An uncut gem. Start by a fingery flake in the centre of the wall. Pull up left from the flake and follow the painful crack to a resting ledge. Step down left and finger traverse onto the smooth headwall where twin rounded cracks provide an unyielding finish. The easier finish up the corner above the resting ledge is a real cop out.

4 May the Foss be with You E4 6b 11m

The central crackline above the flat base. From the flake move right and make a hard pull up the crack to a good hold. Continue up the crack to the top.

5 Thunderthighs E3 6a 13m

Another good pitch starting below a short groove 4m right of the *May the Foss be with You*. Pull into the groove and exit left at the top along a thin flake to a point just right of the central crack. Pull back right to reach a sloping ledge and finish directly up the stepped wall above.

Foss How North

Introduction

A cluster of south and west facing short walls, slabs and ribs providing open climbing on clean rock.

Topo in Duddon guide p 184

Approach

Follow the track alongside the wall through several gates. Pass through the last gate in the wall, turn immediately right and walk south for 120m passing a short slab. The crag lies just round the corner. SD 2415 9875

Pass through the last gate in the wall, turn right and walk diagonally up the hillside (south) .Foss How North West Lower is the first slab..Foss How North West is above on the left.

The first route is on a south-west facing triangular slab behind some boulders.

1 **Crimson Slab** VD 12m

From the lower left corner, climb the slab to its apex and pull out left.

Up to the right are a pair of prominent grooves in a rock pillar.

2 **Wild Goose Chase** HS 4a 13m

From the lowest point start up a rib then climb the left-hand groove using the left edge.

3 **Atomic Bomb** E1 5b 13m

A good route. From the same starting point climb the bold right-hand groove.

Further right is a short south-west facing red wall of quality rock.

4 **Fossphorescence** VS 5a 8m

Climb the left side of the wall to gain a scoop. Finish directly up the pillar above, left of the moss.

5 **Hold the Press** E2 5c 8m

Aptly named. Superb climbing requiring a confident approach. Climb the unprotected red wall.

6 **Shortie** VS 4b

The short wall and corner just right.

Round to the right are two short south-facing ribs with a quartz-speckled wall on the right

7 South Ridge North Foss S 10m

Take a diagonal approach up to the left-hand cracked rib; climb it direct.

8 Frendo VS 4b 8m

Boldly climb the quartz right-hand rib.

9 Block and Tackle S 11m

Climb the left arête of the perched block and the wall above heading up rightwards.

10 Diamond Wall HVS 5a 12m

Start just left of a glacis. Climb the steep quartz slab then the quartz wall above heading uprightwards. Belay well back.

11 Quartz Movement HVS 5a 12m

Climb the steep face via a narrow sloping shelf then pull onto the glacis. The right-hand crack in the wall above starts with a very steep direct pull (protect this move) then the crack is climbed mainly on quartz holds on its left.

12 Conundrum VS 4c 11m

An awkward start to gain a slab leads to a fine pair of cracks in the headwall above.©

Climb the offwidth crack.

Climb the flakes avoiding the offwidth crack.

Climb wall and finish by mossy streak.

The central line of vague weakness up the clean, blank wall. Climb directly on gastons and chicken heads, right of the dark streak to 3/4 height then follow better holds to the left via long moves to the top. Highball V5 with pads.

Introduction

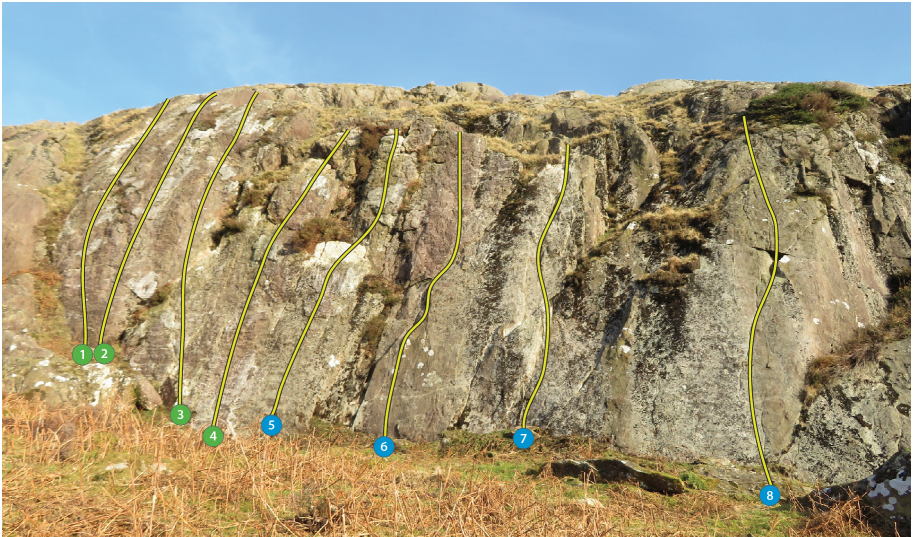
This buttress lies 70m left and round the corner from [Crimson Slab](#).

Approach

Pass through the last gate in the wall, turn right and walk diagonally up the hillside (south) .

Foss How North West Lower is the first slab..

Foss How North West is above on the left.

1 Gitan MS † New 18m

Start just left of [Gypsy](#) and follow a line to the right of the grassy groove and to the left of and parallel with [Gypsy](#).

2 Gypsy S 4a † New 18m

Climbs the delightful quartz blotched slab.

3 Zigenare S 4b † **New** 18m

Start 1m right and 1m below [Gypsy](#). Climb leftwards to a cleaned diagonal break to step left onto the right side of [Gypsy](#) slab, follow this with interest to the top.

4 Bohemian S 4a † **New** 11m

Starts just right of [Zigenare](#) and climbs directly up to a crevasse just below the top.

5 Romany MVS 4b † **New** 13m

Takes the steep slab some 2m left of [Itinerant Preacher](#). Climb the slab for 2m to either: move right and up to good holds and a ledge; or move left and up on nubbins and edges to move right to the good holds and ledge. Continue up the steepening above on good holds to finish.

6 Itinerant Preacher VS 4b † **New** 13m

Takes the diagonal fault 8m right of [Gypsy](#) and the crinkly slab above.

7 Les Grimpeurs Vieillissants HS 4b † **New** 13m

Start some 2m right of [Itinerant Preacher](#) at a shallow right-facing corner. Climb the corner to a sloping ledge on the left continue up on creaking flakes to improving holds leading to the top.

8 Deportee HVS 5b † **New** 14m

Climb a thin crack in a rippled slab to a niche followed by easier slabs above.

9 Refugee E1 5a † **New** 16m



Climbs the prominent pillar. The blunt rib above gives an exciting finish.

10 L'Enfer, C'est les Autres HS 4a † **New** 16m

Takes the slab immediately to the right of [Refugee](#) with interesting moves throughout, to finish left of a coppiced juniper.

11 Encore une Putain Bonne Journee VD † **New** 16m

Start just to the right of [L'Enfer...](#) & climb directly to a hanging crack, follow it & the ensuing natural line to finish to the right of the coppiced juniper.

12 Y'a d'la joie S 4a † **New** 16m

A direct line, starting from the top of the boulder at the base of the crag, keeping strictly to the right of [Encore..](#), up to finish up a slab.

13 Deliverance S 4a † **New** 16m

Climbs the system of flakes and cracks right of the vegetated fault.

Foss How North West RHS

14 La Haine S 4a 15m

Climbs the 'sentry box' groove and the wall above, starting from a waist high ledge.

15 L'amour E1 5c 15m

Short but sharp. Climb the thin in the rib to the right of [La Haine](#). Bouldery moves over the scooped bulge provide a tricky crux.

16 Spiral VS 4b † New 15m

Starting 2m left of [Bodacious](#), awkwardly gain a sloping ledge at head height & step left up the slab to a shallow right-facing corner & crack, follow the continuation crack to finish.

17 Bodacious HVS 5a 15m

The hanging crack on the right side of the crag. A delicate start leads to the base of the crack which is followed more easily to the top.

18 Bruiser MVS 4b 15m

The intermittent crack system 2m right of [Bodacious](#).

19 Bushwacker HS 4b 18m

From the lower right end of the crag gain the parallel ledges slanting from right to left, to finish just right of [Bruiser](#).
